In this edition, we focus on the clear steps for growing everlastings. Everlastings will add a touch of elegance, but also require minimal maintenance. Let's delve into the world of Everlastings and discover how to plant, care for, and prevent common garden issues.

1. Timing of planting

The ideal time to plant Everlastings (for most of Australia) is in Autumn, or NOW, once the heat of summer has passed. Planting at this time allows the plants to establish strong root systems before winter sets in. With warm, moist conditions in the soil, it is perfect for vigorous growth!





2. Weed control

Before planting, clear the garden bed of any weeds or debris. Everlastings thrive in weed-free environments, as competition for nutrients and water can hinder their growth.

Regularly inspect your garden bed and remove any weeds as soon as they appear. Mulching can also help suppress weed growth and conserve soil moisture. REMEMBER the better the weed control, the longer your everlastings will look perfect!

3. Soil preparation

Everlastings prefer well-drained soil with a slightly acidic to neutral pH level. Prepare the soil by digging it up a little to make it light and fluffy...easy for roots to grow. You can add a little organic matter or fertiliser, to improve its fertility if you'd like! Below is a picture of a rotary hoe, about to dig up a very hard garden bed, expecting a beautiful front entrance in September!



4. Pest control

Protect your Everlastings from common garden pests, such as snails and slugs as they are VERY susceptible to them. Especially snails, as they come at night and nip the everlastings before you even realise it!

Some common control methods to control the pesky snails is to creating physical barriers, use egg shells or by using organic snail pellets. Regularly inspect your plants for signs of infestation and take prompt action if needed! Ask

your local nursery if you are concerned.

Below is a picture of a beer trap. To do this, place a small pool of beer in your everlasting patch, and add a cover to keep rain and irrigation water out. The aroma of yeast attracts slugs and snails, causing them to fall into the trap and drown. This method is so simple, effective, and safe!



5. Sowing and watering in

Scatter the Everlasting seeds evenly over the soil surface and lightly rake to ensure good seed-to-soil contact. Gently water in to hold them to the soil, preventing them from blowing away!
