Rain has arrived, get PLANTING !!

1. Choose a perfect site!

Selecting the right location for your everlastings is crucial for their growth and longevity. Ensure ample sunlight and a well-drained soil.



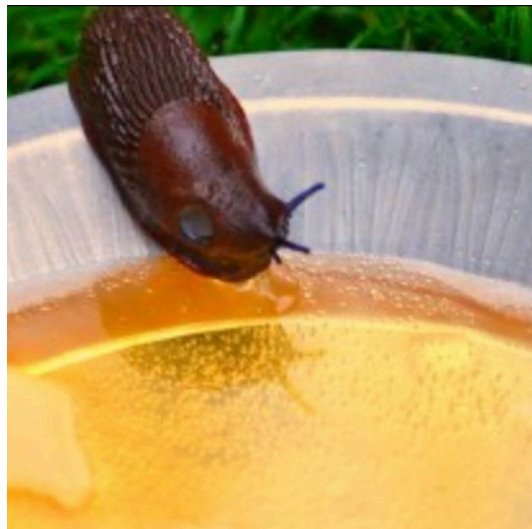
2. Great weed control is key.

Weeds can be a nuisance to your everlastings, competing for nutrients and water. Prioritize regular weeding to keep your garden beds clean and ensure that your everlastings have the best chance to flourish. Consider using mulch to suppress weed growth and retain moisture in the soil.



3. Control your pests!

Control all pests in your garden, especially snails! Snails can be pesky and eat your everlastings. Make sure you implement effective snail control measures such as copper tape around planters to deter them, handpicking or using organic snail baits to keep their population in check. Beer trapping is also great (pictured)!



If you have already planted, and they've come up...



You can...

1. Fertilise with an all purpose fertiliser. Best to apply when the seedlings are about 8cm high.
2. Look to control weeds. If you are spraying grass weeds, best to spray when the weeds are 2-leaf and before tillering. Otherwise you will have to hand-pick!
3. If your everlastings are perfect, do nothing!

Remember, a little extra care and attention during the planting process can go a long way in ensuring the success of your everlastings. So, roll up your sleeves, put on your gardening gloves, and let's create a vibrant and blooming garden together!
