What to do when your Everlastings have finished blooming -



How to collect seed ~

Wait until the flowers have fully dried, petals fallen off and the seed is starting to spill out of the flowerhead. Shake the seed into a paper bag and store.

Do not collect seed too early!!



- Three pointers
 1) Leave them and wait until the seed drops on the ground
- 2) Remove or mow over the stalky stems and plant something else
- 3) Collect the seed and replant elsewhere



Get rid of your PESKY WEEDS without pulling up your flowers!

Grab a Yates Weed Paint Brush and simply dab the weed — no pulling or uprooting half your flowers in the process! Just a gentle touch, and the weed will gradually shrink and disappear, leaving your Everlasting display perfectly intact and blooming beautifully!

DOWN ON THE FARM



With the live sheep export ban coming into effect in 2027, many farmers have sold their sheep, creating a major shortage. And with fewer sheep comes less wool... which means prices have skyrocketed! Good news for those of us still in the industry!
